Prachar Vibhag National Meet Held In Lucknow

Muslim Students in UP's RSS Schools Rise 30% in 3 years

Allahabad : The number of Muslim students in the schools run by Vidya Bharati, the educational wing of RSS, has witnessed an increase of approximately 30% in the past 3 years, About 12,000 Muslim and Christian students are studying in these schools in Uttar Pradesh. Moreover, Vidya Bharati has recruited Muslims as a teacher also. Muslim students also recite "Shlokas" and "Bhajan Mantras" and are doing well in the study as well as sports. Mohd Afsar and in Mohd Sahban, students of Jwala Devi Saraswati Vidya Mandir Inter College, Prayagraj, won gold in the hammer throw at recent "Khelo India Youth Games" in Guwahati.

"The urge for good and quality education has been the prime reason for the rise in the number of Muslim students. In

2016, the number of Muslim students in our school in east UP, comprising 49 districts, was 6,890, it increased to 9,037 in 2019," said Chintamani Singh, additional secretary, Vidya Bharati (East Uttar Pradesh). Singh said around six lakh students are studying in the Vidya Bharati schools in UP, with the majority in rural areas.

Many Muslim boys and girls studying in Saraswati Shishu Mandir and Saraswati Vidya Mandir have brought laurels to their schools in sports, cultural activities and academic, he said "we started sending our wards to these schools because of the quality of the education. Earlier, there was the myth that these schools are only for Hindus and they don't admit minorities," said Mohd Chand, a parent. (Courtesy Times Of India)

Give Education and training to students on 'indigenous and natural farming - Umendra Dutt

15 February, Vidya Dham, Jalandhar : The fourth NRI conference dedicated to the 550th Prakash Parv of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji concluded in the Sarvahithakari Shiksha Samiti premises with active support from NRIs in the education service campaign for schools being run in the border areas. The conference was held in Dr. Ambedkar Auditorium of Vidya Dham, the headquarters of the Sarvahitkari Shiksha Samiti, in which nationally and internationally reputed NRIs and scholars participated.

“Even after India’s independence, education was not given as much attention as was required. Our education system

continued as before. After independence, our education system should have been indigenous, but the then rulers did not understand the need to pay attention to it. In 1952, the first Saraswati Vidya Mandir was started in Gorakhpur, Uttar Pradesh, with the aim to instill reverence and self-respect for the great men and traditions of our country. The people of the country were very impressed by our working method and the public accepted this work wholeheartedly, as a result of which this work gradually increased and expanded in all the provinces of the country. Vidya Bharati Akhil Bhartiya Shkisha Santhan was established in 1977. In 1952, the work which was in the form of a seed, today it has taken the form of a banyan tree. Today, 13 thousand formal and 15 thousand informal educational institutions are being run efficiently throughout the country. There are also 127 formal and 377 informal (single teacher schools) in Punjab.



There were the views expressed by Sri Shivkumar, All India Secretary of Vidya Bharati.

Sri Manoj, the organiser of this conference, said that the Sarvahitik Shiksha Samiti had started this effort three years back to connect the non-resident Indians of Punjab with the education services here. This is the fourth conference. As a result of this effort, more than 10 NRIs have joined the education service sector in different areas of Punjab. A large number of sanskar centers are being opened in the remote villages of Punjab.

In the inaugural session of the conference, Sri Umendra Dutt, who has played a leading role in promoting Punjab's leading social service and natural agriculture, said that agriculture has to be linked with food, nutrition for students' health. He also called upon the Sarvakathikar Shiksha Samiti to connect students with natural farming. He further said that after the Green Revolution, Punjab filled the food grains of the country, but it had to pay a huge price. Due to this Green Revolution, so much water has been removed from the earth

that today in most parts of Punjab this water level has reduced to a worrying level. If today we don't improve ourselves, then the day is not far when we will strive for every droplet of water.

80 NRIs from 35 countries participated in this conference. Everyone praised this work of education service and pledged to join it. In this conference, an attractive exhibition of art work and pickles made by the students of Sarvahitikari Vidya Mandir was also organized. In the program, the students of the all-purpose Vidya Mandir, Ladowali Road performed Giddha. The performances of Prakashvati Sarvahitikari Vidya Mandir and Sarvashakthi Keshav Vidya Niketan were also lauded.

Doctor With A Golden Heart - Dr Sameer Choudhary Set Up 'Little Star Foundation' To Provide Home To Orphan Girls



According to the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF), India has approximately 30 million abandoned children, most of which are girls. Only a small percentage of these children receive institutionalised care or are adopted by families. An overwhelming number of children are left homeless, without any hope of a future.

Faced with such dire situations Dr. Sameer Choudhary took up the responsibility to provide proper home to children, who are in desperate need of shelter.

Dr Sameer Choudhary, an alumnus of Saraswati Shishu Mandir Higher Secondary School Nai Basti Katni, Madhya Pradesh, is a practicing pediatrician for the past 20 years. In the year 2005, he

founded a female orphanage along with his wife, named 'Little Star Children Home', under the 'Little Star Foundation', to provide home to girls who were abandoned by their families. This foundation provides education, health care, shelter and vocational training to the girls till they reach 18 years of age.

While talking about his experiences and struggles faced during setting up of the orphanage, Dr Choudhary shared a few instances that influenced him to take up this step.

In the year 2005, a 2 month old baby girl in severe condition, was brought to his clinic by police constables. Someone had tied her up and thrown her into the river in the nearby village. A person had heard the sound and saved her from drowning.

After treating and stabilising the child, Dr. Chaudhary asked the police to get her admitted to a government hospital. He was aware that there are no safeguards in government hospitals, but legal issues associated with such cases deterred him.

The government hospital was unable to treat her properly and she was sent back to Dr. Chaudhary. He continued to treat the child and recruited hospital staff to look after her. After her recovery, the local administration was unable to make any arrangements for her to stay. The child stayed in the hospital and the nurses named her 'Sameera', after Dr. Chaudhary. When there was no place for her to go, Dr. Chaudhary made up his mind to take care of her.

Soon another abandoned little girl in serious condition was admitted to the hospital and was treated by Dr. Chaudhary. With her future obscured in uncertainty as well, Dr. Chaudhary rented a house and placed the children there under the care of a housekeeper. In the meantime the district Collector, helped him to deal with the legal aspects. After the legal matter was settled, he talked with his wife and brother and decided to raise the girls himself. Soon 50 more abandoned girls were brought to the orphanage and became a part of the family.

Dr. Chaudhary, never took any help from the government and used his own money to support the

upbringing of the girls. Although many refused to help, few of his friends and family members pitched in with everyday necessities like milk, vegetables, etc. Slowly Dr. Chaudhary bought a land and constructed a building to provide a comfortable and safe environment to all the children.

All the girls in the orphanage are treated like family by Dr. Chaudhary, and they are provided with education, dance classes, karate class, etc like any other normal child. Many children were adopted by loving families and found a good home. Gradually government grants also came in, which made it possible to provide better facilities to the girls. Many renowned personalities also come to spend time with the girls and volunteer to teach them different skills. For Dr. Chaudhary, the most precious reward for his efforts is to see the girls facing the world with confidence and following their dreams.

The story of Dr. Chaudhary is truly inspirational and a role model for all Vidya Bharati students.



Vidya Bharti Alumni, Parichay Mishra, Changing The Face Of Sports In Chhattisgarh



The history of sports in India goes back to the Vedic age and it was considered as an integral part of human development. In a country, as massive as India, there is a treasure trove of sporting talent in every corner. In spite of the rich history, the massive pool of young talent and passionate sport loving citizens, our country continues to lag behind several other countries in sports.

There are several reasons behind this situation, one of which being lack of proper and affordable training facilities. Sadly, other than the major cities and towns, there is not much infrastructure and encouragement for sports and games. Faced with such dire circumstances, it becomes the responsibility of both the government and the citizens to push towards opening more training facilities at low costs so that more and more talented youngsters of our country get the

opportunity to hone their skills.

Vidya Bharati have always laid great stress on promotion of sports, and many of its students and alumni have gone on to prove their merit in national and international arenas. Taking Vidya Bharati's legacy forward towards advancement of sports, is Parichay Mishra, an alumnus of Saraswati Shishu Mandir Bhatapara, Chhattisgarh.

Mr. Mishra passed his 12th examination in 2009. Throughout his school years he had been an avid sports enthusiast and national level Judo player. After passing out, he remained connected with his school and helped to train students in different forms of sports. In 2012, he got the opportunity to be a part of Vidya Bharati's student council and became the district convener of the student council.

On the educational front, he completed his engineering degree from Pragati Engineering College and

joined the Electrical Department of Kruti Institute of Technology as an Assistant Professor. While working there he completed his Masters in English. Due to his active participation in different kinds of Vidya Bharati related work, in 2017, he was made the province head of Vidya Bharati Alumni Council, Chhattisgarh.

By the age of 27, Mr. Mishra, had helped more than 1000 players to compete in the national level sports competitions. The highest point in his career came when he got the privilege of being a part of the Indian contingent in the Asian Games held in Jakarta Indonesia in 2018.

He has also acted as judge in numerous sports competitions and got the opportunity to participate in the bilateral negotiations on behalf of the Sports and Youth Ministry.

Presently Mr. Mishra is working as a Governmental Physical Education Teacher and also holds the post of Province Head in

Chhattisgarh's Vidya Bharati Alumni Council.

Throughout his life, Mr. Mishra has been associated with several kinds of social work. As a member of Akhil Bharatiya Vidyarthi Parishad, he used to help poor students with sports material as per their need. He also gave free sports training to Vidya Bharati students, who could not afford coaches. Presently he is trying to set up a proper sports training facility in Chhattisgarh, so that the upcoming players from the state can be groomed to compete on an international level.

When asked how his school has impacted him, Mr. Mishra gave his school full credit towards shaping his life, as it is today. He also conveyed his gratitude towards his school principal, Shri Sohanlal Chandrakar Ji, for igniting the passion for sports in him.

Mr. Mishra's passion and dedication towards sports and Vidya Bharati is truly inspirational.

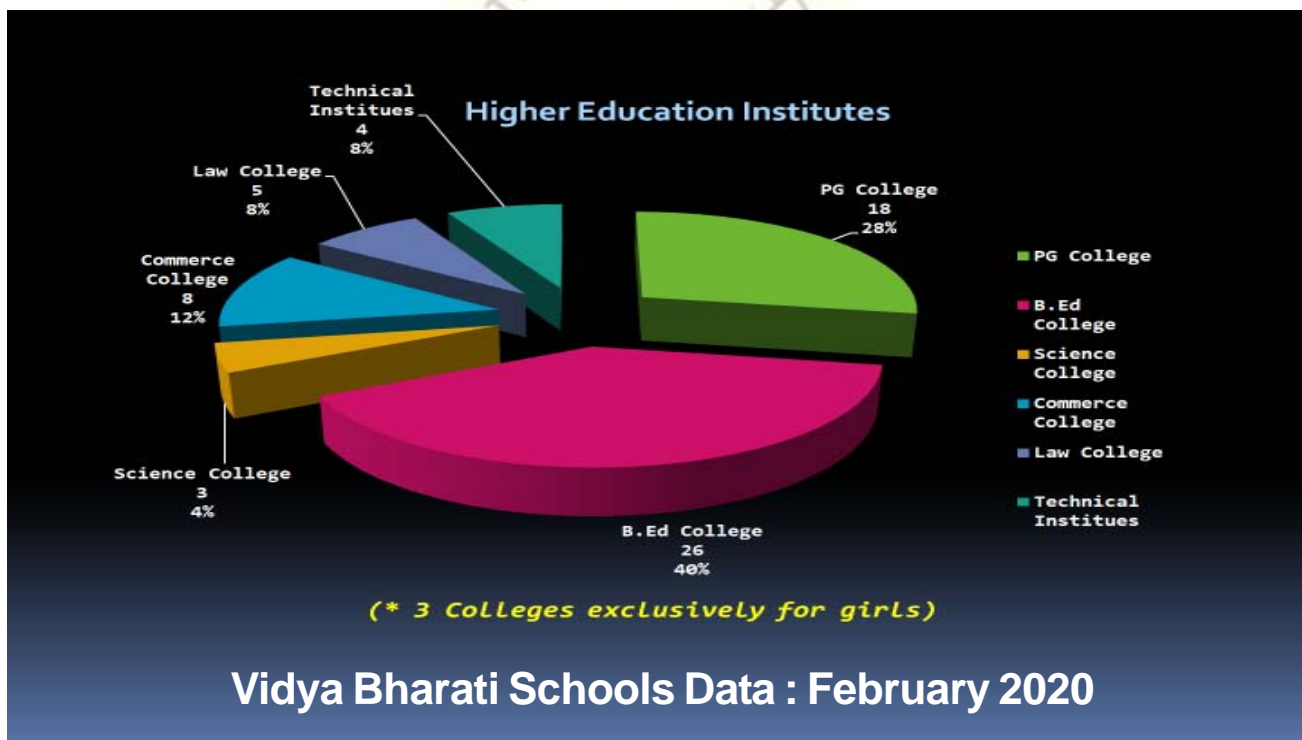
