Lecture on Bharatiya Bhasha Diwas at Atal University**

Workshop for Resource Persons on Panchpadi Learning Methodology

Kurukshetra | A five-day workshop for resource persons on the Panchpadi learning methodology was organized at Vidya Bharati Sanskriti Shiksha Sansthan, Kurukshetra. On this occasion, Organizing Secretary, Shri Gobind Chandra Mahant, stated that Panchpadi is the core teaching methodology of Bharat. He emphasized that through Panchpadi, efforts should be made for the holistic and all-round development of children. He urged the participants to fully develop themselves as resource persons and to become capable of implementing this methodology in their respective states and regions. Referring to two books, 'Panchpadi Learning Methodology' and 'The Concept of Panchkoshha-based and Holistic Development in Bharatiya Education', he mentioned the target of introducing them at the school level by the year 2025.



Carry Forward the Panchpadi Process - Avnish Bhatnagar

Shri Avnish Bhatnagar, General Secretary, emphasized that inherent perfection exists within every human being, and education is the means to manifest it. He explained the concepts of Panchpadi: knowledge is not imparted from outside; rather, it is innate and concealed within, and it is the teacher's responsibility to unveil it. Education is abstract, while the teacher embodies its concrete form, imparting knowledge to students. A teacher does not teach; instead, the student learns. Citing a verse from the Gita, "श्रद्धावान् लभते ज्ञानम् तत्परः संयतेन्द्रियः" (One with faith, dedication, and controlled senses attains knowledge), Avnish Ji stressed that without faith, learning is impossible. Similarly, if a student lacks readiness to learn, he cannot acquire knowledge. Moreover, the learner must have control over senses.

These three aspects must be present in the classroom environment for effective learning based on the Panchpadi methodology. He outlined three objectives of learning: the development of reasoning ability, exploration ability, and power of expression. Expression can only be effective when the subject matter is well understood. Without these three components, the purpose of education remains incomplete. Avnish Ji urged everyone to collectively carry forward this Panchpadi process in their field.

Embrace Panchpadi with an Open Mind: D. Ramakrishna Rao

Vidya Bharati's President, Shri D. Ramakrishna Rao, emphasized that after acquiring proficiency, we will take on lead roles and become key resource persons. As we gain expertise, we will go through the process of transition from being instructors to advisors and eventually become mentors. This mindset should guide us as we move forward.

Highlighting three qualities of an excellent teacher, he said: understanding the message behind silence, sensing the essence behind ignorance, and perceiving the emotion behind innocence. He encouraged everyone to accept the Panchpadi methodology with an open and calm mind, focus on goals, explain small topics with sensitivity, maintain harmony in schools environment, and work towards societal integration.

The Organizing Secretary, Shri Gobind Chandra Mahant, stated that Vidya Bharati volunteers are actively working to advance the

"Panchpadi" methodology following the introduction of the NEP. He referenced two books titled "Panchpadi Learning Methodology" and "The Concept of Panchkosha and Holistic Development in Indian Education" and mentioned that the goal is to implement these concepts at the school level by the year 2025. He emphasized that Vidya Bharati's educational approach will be carried forward more effectively.
