
Chennai: Three books on social science were presented to the Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi by Vidya Bharati Akhil Bharatiya Shiksha Sansthan and Chinmaya Yuva Kendra. These three books have been prepared according to the National Education Policy 2020 for the students of classes VI, VII, and VIII. These books are being adopted in about 25 Vidya Bharati schools and 5 Chinmaya Vidyalayas in Chennai from the academic year 2022-23

The social science books for classes VI, VII and VIII prepared by Vidya Bharati and Chinmaya Yuva Kendra were presented to the Prime Minister during the one-day visit of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi to Chennai. These three books have been published under the title Radiant Bharat, Resilient Bharat. and Resurgent **Bharat** respectively. Special provision has been made in the National Education Policy to include regional material in social science books. Keeping this in mind, adequate space has been given to regional material in the Social Science books published for classes VI, VII and VIII.

Vidya Bharati North Tamil Nadu and Chinmaya Mission, Chennai conceived a project to undo this situation by rewriting the history to bring out the truth and present the history of India to the students who if inspired by their ancestors will grow a sense of pride. In 2019, there was a preliminary discussion on this subject between the representatives of Vidya Bharati and the Head of Chinmaya Yuva Kendra Swami Mitranand Ji. At that time a reference had also come to the fore that provision has also been made for the inclusion of regional material in Social Science textbooks in the National Policy on Education.

As a fellow-up, a formal meeting was held under the chairmanship of Swami Mitranand Ji, Head of Chinmaya Yuva Kendra, Akhil Bhartiya President of Vidya Bharati, Shri D. Ramakrishna Rao, Kshetra President Shri T. Chakraborty, and other representatives.





In compliance with the decision taken in this meeting, teams of principals, education officers, history teachers, and volunteers of Vidya Bharati and Chinmaya Mission were formed. Among them, 70 teachers of Vidya Bharati and representatives of 30 Chinmaya Mission schools were involved. These teams after two years of research, writing, editing. designing, developed Social Science books for classes VI, VII, and VIII respectively titled Resilient Radiant Bharat. Bharat, and Resurgent Bharat. Before finalizing the books, Swami Mitranand Ji went through each page suggested and word and necessary improvements. In preparing the three textbooks, Vidya Bharati's alumni Head Shriram Ji made an invaluable contribution. These books were released in a grand ceremony at the Chinmaya Heritage Center in Chennai last April. On this occasion, historian Vikram Sampath, author and filmmaker of two volumes on VD Savarkar Vivek Agnihotri, Vidya Bharati South Central Zone President Uma Maheshwara Rao and Vivekananda Educational Society President N. Gopalaswami etc. were present.

Authentic and India-centric History Narrative Required

National Symposium on Computer Science/IT in the Enlightenment of Indian Knowledge System

Adopt Value-Based Education model for holistic development- Prof. Reddy







Kurukshetra. Department of Computer Applications NIT, Kurukshetra and Vidya Bharati Uchcha Shiksha Sansthan, Noida (UP) jointly organized a two-days National Workshop on "Computer Science/IT in the enlightenment of NEP 2020 and Indian Knowledge System" on 25-26 May 2022. In the inaugural session, NIT

Kurukshetra Director Prof. B. V. Raman Reddy said that the National Education Policy is based on sustainable development. We have to revisit our ancient knowledge and find out how it can help in the advancement of our technology sector for sustainable development. Prof. Reddy emphasized a value-based education model instead of a result-based education model for holistic development.

In the first session of the workshop, Professor Girish Nath Jha of JNU Delhi spoke on Panini's Grammar and Computer Science. In the second session, the role of the National Education Policy in computer education was given by Professor Ashutosh Kumar Singh, Head of the Department of Computer Applications. The third session focused on the Adoption of IKS in Computer Science Books which was discussed by Dr. Lalit Mohan Goel, YMCA Faridabad.

In the workshop on the second day, Dr. Aparna Lalingkara, Mathematician and Educational Technologist stressed the need to update



computer science books. Dr. Gajendra Pratap Singh Associate Professor, JNU Delhi spoke on the difference between the Pingala system and modern systems and how attempts to understand the Pingala system could accelerate the development of Indian Vedic Mathematics in computers. Anirudh Singhal, Robotic Engineer, TCS explained how Vedic philosophy can

help to solve the problem of the new world. He said when the quadratic logic is no longer valid how can the Vedic logic system i.e. tri-value or multivalue be used to investigate such problems.


