World over, all big and long-lasting transformations have been preceded by social awakening, thereafter systemic and administrative changes have followed. Education that encourages teaching in one's mother tongue as a policy is a highly reasonable opinion; the government/administration is paying attention to this by way of the National Education Policy (NEP). But do parents want their children to be taught in their mother tongue? Or chasing so-called financial gain or career (for which more than education, enterprise, courage and intuitive knowledge are required) chimeras, do they want their wards to become a part of a blind rat race? When expecting the government to institute the promotion of the mother tongue, we should also consider whether we sign our names in our mother tongue or not. Whether the nameplates affixed on our residences rendered in the mother tongue or not? Whether household invitations bear the texts in the mother tongue or not?

The New Education Policy should lead to students becoming highly cultured, good human beings who are also inspired by patriotism – this is everyone's desire. But are well-educated and intellectual parents aware of this overall objective of education when they send their children to schools and universities? Education is not imparted only in classrooms. The home environment of 'Sanskars' (ethical conduct) and the duties of the parents thereof, mediums that influence social behaviors and discipline, public figures and leaders, festivals, carnivals, social gatherings, etc also play a major role. How much attention do we pay to that? Without these exposures, only school-going education cannot be effective.

Skill Development In School: An Effort..

Saraswati Gramodaya Vidyalaya, Govindnagar

Madhya Pradesh | In the Saraswati Gramodaya activity-based school, great work is being done for the development of the students as per the National Education Policy. The school is dedicated to the development of family skills. It is our endeavor that every student of the school can be proficient in some or the other hand skill. For this purpose, training workshops are being organized simultaneously so that special teachers can be prepared and can get teaching work done according to the present needs. Some special courses have been prescribed by the school so that the students can be skilled. The main among them are bamboo art, maati-Kala, carpentry, workmanship, electrical work, plumbing, welding and agricultural work. The best trainers are needed to master the above tasks. Some tasks are conducted in the school throughout the year like carpentry, electrical, etc. At the time of conducting these works, students can be attached to the instructor, but the instructor is appointed to teach electrical work in the continuing school.

Along with whose duration is fixed, there is also an electrical workshop where children study both practical and theoretical. The companions also improved the damaged electrical equipment in the homes and the bad equipment of the school under guidance and training. The work of motor winding is different but it has also been linked to the electrical workshop in the school. Where the work of plumbing the motor, windings of cooler fans, etc., such as caps of taps, cutting boards on the walls, curtains, etc., is done by the students by forming groups.

There is also a Krishi Vigyan Kendra related to the institution, where children understand the nuances of agricultural work under the guidance of agricultural scientists and also see them experimentally so that they get practical



knowledge of agricultural skills. Through our other project, Gramgyan Peeth, children are getting practical training in Basskala and Matikala, in which they learn to make plates, kulhads, bowls, idols and other toys from bamboo dustbins, lamps, decorative items and clay. Special training is organized from time to time in the school for daily useful skills like Mehndi, Rangoli, Tailoring and Cooking. A workshop is also available in the school for welding works. Where the work of balding is taught. There is a large computer laboratory so that children can learn coding as well as other PTPs. Hindi and English typing are taught along with work etc.

The practical courses of skill development bring self-reliance in the children which fills them with confidence. Due to this, the students can face the challenges of life.

EDUCATE A GIRL, SHE WILL CHANGE THE WORLD **"North Region Meeting on Girls' Education Held in Kurushetra"**

Savitribai Phule "We shall overcome and success will be ours in the future. The future belongs to us."



First Session - Nature of the meeting and its objective

Speaker: Smt. Kusum Kaushal

To develop the mature girl child physically, vitally, mentally and intellectually. Women are rich in special qualities. She can create and can hold like the earth. Men and women are two parts of the same seed. Both have the same responsibility to take this world towards progress. Family plays an important role in the development of a cultured girl child. Therefore, family monitoring is one of the main dimensions of girl child education. To solve the problems related to adolescence, to realize the pride of being a woman, to tell the scientific basis of motherhood, fasts, festivals, to carry out the tradition of joint family and to make girls recognize their natural qualities is the main objective of girl education. School is an important medium for achieving this objective.

Second Session - Education of the Girl Child in Present Scenario:

Speaker: Ms. Rekha Chudasama

Girl education is the central idea of Vidya Bharati. This topic was initiated 35 years ago. The aim of the contemplation was - to provide quality education to the girl child and make her self-reliant. Although today's girl child is leading in all fields and making and shaping her career yet she shouldn't be detached and ambitious from her natural qualities. There is a need to develop such qualities in the girl child so that she can coordinate both her career and family.

Third Session - Audio-Visual (Girls Education Courses and Activities)

Speaker : Ms. Rekha Chudasama

To implement girls' education in schools, the prescribed curriculum and activities are shown through PPT. The subject of girl child education should not be taken as an additional subject and should be integrated and taught with other subjects. Through motivational video clippings, Motherhood, love and moral values are inculcated in the girl child. The girl child must learn self-protection tricks to keep herself safe in odd situations.

Fourth Session - National Education Policy and Education of the Girl Child

Speaker: Shri Deshraj Sharma

National Education Policy recognizes the unique and important role of women in society and their contribution to shaping the ethics of present and future generations. SEDG girls should be provided with quality education. The best way would be to raise the education level of the generations. This policy recommends that the policies and schemes being formulated for the upliftment of SEDG students should focus on the girl child of these groups. The Government of Bharat will set up a 'Gender Inclusive Fund' to develop the country's capacity towards providing quality and equitable education to all girls as well as transgender students at places where girls have to travel long distances to reach school. Free hostels will be constructed there on the lines of Navodaya Vidyalaya, especially for girls coming from socio-economically disadvantaged backgrounds. In these, suitable arrangements will be made for the safety of girls. Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalayas will be further strengthened and further expanded to increase the participation of girls from socio-economically backward groups in quality education schools (up to Grade 12).

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Fifth Session - Handling adolescence is the basis of a future happy life

Speaker: Shri Avneesh Bhatnagar

The attitude of the family towards the girl child has changed a lot. The awareness about the education and career of the girl child is increasing, but the responsibilities towards the family are decreasing. Due to the changes taking place in society, the lifestyle and food habits of the girl child are changing. She wants to keep herself away from adjectives like 'sister'. Teaching girls to stand firm in the strong storm of change can be done successfully through girls' education. The stories of the struggle of women who have achieved special achievements in special fields should be told to bring awareness among the girls. If we consider the journey of life development as a tree, then the root of the tree reflects the experiences of life, the stem represents the culture and character formation and the flowers and the leaves reflect the experiences of good and bad personality development. We have to present logic and scientific basis to adolescent boys and girls, only then they will agree with us. Only a capable and cultured girl can keep her family tied in the thread of unity.

Sixth Session - Organizational Form, Planning and Implementation of "Balika Shiksha"

Speaker : Shri Surendra Attri

Organizational form, planning and implementing the plan are very necessary and important aspects for the successful implementation of any work. Based on organizational structure, orders and decisions go from top to bottom i.e. school level and suggestions and amendments reach all Bharat levels from the school level. Migration is also very essential for expanding the work. Before going on our journey, we should be fully prepared. The subject should be studied thoroughly. To substantiate your point, some persuasive, logical and practical contexts should be used.

Seventh Session - New Experiments

Speaker : Ms. Rekha Chudasama

Some of the earlier experiments to be done in the field of girl education like Saraswati Yatra (experience-based education), Mata-Dutri Sammelan, Girls

The arrangement of classrooms and counseling centers is very useful in schools. To take the subject of girl child education to the girls and parents, new experiments should be done constantly.

Eighth Session - Kanya Bharati, Girl's Council Formation

Ninth Session - Action Research

Speaker : Dr. Jitendra Jangla

Teaching is a continuous process and change is the rule of society. Time probably does not stop, the changes that come, do not stop and technology also keeps on coming before us in new colors. Therefore, every teacher should try to learn new technology so that his teaching art keeps on flourishing. Science and technology are complementary to each other. Just as the body is not possible without the soul, in the same way, science is also incomplete without technology, we have to connect education with daily life. The solution to the coming problem is possible only when we find the root of that problem. While teaching we should be clear about our purpose. Students have to assimilate the subject so that their creativity is developed. The teacher considers himself successful only when every student in the class understands his subject and can connect the principles of the subject with daily activities. Every student should be observed by the teacher, only then the child's concentration will remain on the subject. The teacher should do self-assessment from time to time. The best way to do this is through Action Research.

Models presented by Young Scientists

Students scientists studying in Vidya Bharati's schools presented many experimental models related to dirty water cleaning machines, the history of computers, scientific ways to conserve coal, chemical cycle in daily life, road accident prevention devices and solar energy and also demonstrated their scientific talent.

Upgradation of Asha Rani Gyanchand Jain Saraswati Shishu Mandir, Naya Gaon, Dehradun

Asha Rani Gyan Chand Jain Saraswati Shishu Mandir is located at Naya gaon Paleo, Dehradun. It is 17km away from ISBT Dehradun. In 2017-18, the school was on the verge of closure and there were 11 students left. With the help of the provincial officials and the Prithvikul Foundation, a plan was made to run the school on a new theme and the following works were implemented in the school.

1. Basic Infrastructure

- Main Building: On the main walls of the school, Bharatiya culture-based banners, paints and some art-related work were done.
- Common Area: An exhibition based on various themes has been developed in the gallery area of the school. A small general running track was also prepared according to the condition of the school like Bharat Ratna, Param Vir Chakra, Musician, sportspersons, etc.
- Classroom: The classroom of the school was designed on the theme of jungle, sea, space, etc. Flashcards were made on the walls by making magnetic, which is also an important step for the implementation of bagless education, school furniture and students seating.

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2. Work was also done on the arrangement of hardware:

The latest technology is used extensively in the school. Mobile tablet projectors, computers, learning kits (sports, health-medicine, science maths, mind games music/fine arts/dance), etc. have been added which are used smoothly in the school.

3. Planet School Pedagogy Upgrade

The following teaching methods are adopted in the school-

- Pre-Primary: Bag-Free Education
- Multilingual: Rapid learning of multiple Bharatiya and global languages
- Stem: Re-discovered, Re-invented, Projects, Olympiad
- Career: Mentors, Counselling, Role play activities, Skills, Path Guidance
- Health: Monthly checkup (weight/height/disease/eyes etc.)
- Art: Dance, Music, Fine Arts: Sample Activity Videos, Competitions
- Global Exposure: Guest Teacher, Online Video Conferencing, etc.
- Physical: Sports, Fitness, etc.

Steps Towards Self-Reliance

Multi Skill Foundation Lab at Durgavati Hemraj Tah Saraswati Vidya Mandir, Nehru Nagar, Ghaziabad

Ghaziabad | Although today, we promote Education yet on the other hand, due to an increase in mechanization, employment opportunities have decreased. To get this employment, everyone is joining the blind race of competition. The need for change in the present education system was felt so that after leaving school, the students could easily get employment opportunities without participating in any competitive race. This problem is resolved as in the National Education Policy 2020, a multi-skill foundation course has been arranged as a vocational course. It has been emphasized that steps should be taken to set up multi-skill foundation labs in every school so that students can acquire technical as well as intellectual knowledge.

Following the National Education Policy 2020, a Multi Skill Foundation Lab was started in the Vidyalaya in April 2022 at Durgavati Hemraj Tah Saraswati Vidya Mandir, Nehru Nagar, Ghaziabad. This lab aims to develop technical skills in the students. It greatly helps the students to recognize their technical skills at an early stage of education. Presently there are four subjects in the lab established in the school –

1. Energy and Environment –

At present, it is seen that every person is leaving the old technology and resource and adopting new technology. Today man is leaving fire and smoke and moving towards electricity and equipment powered by it. In such a situation, this course helps provide technical knowledge related to the bulbs and fans used in homes, heaters, coolers, switches, etc. Well, this course is called CBSE. It is implemented from the 9th standard in education but we have started it for exposure in small classes. With this, students will be efficient in doing small tasks in their homes and at the same time will prove helpful in

keeping the environment clean.

2. Workshop and Engineering Techniques –

Through this course, students get basic knowledge of mechanical work. In this, students acquire skills in opening, tying and repairing machines, including scooters, motorcycles, cars, etc. Learn to use woodwork like making a table, chair, bed, cupboard, saw, Bussola, planer, hammer, inch tape, etc. Students also get information about the house, shop construction and repair and mixing in the correct proportion of brick, cement, sand, Badarpur, etc.

3. Food and Processing Techniques –

According to science, what kind of food we have to eat, how much food is necessary for our body and which nutrients are useful for our body, students get all this information from this course. Along with this, they acquire proficiency in preparing pure, simple, sattvic food at the school level.

4. Gardening-Nursing and Agriculture Techniques –

Bharat is an agricultural country but today interest in agriculture is decreasing among students. This course provides basic information about agriculture to the students about weeding, hoeing and sowing of crops and timings. Apart from this, planting saplings in homes, makes them skilled in fertilizing, watering and pruning, etc. Students learn to plant seeds and make new plants, discover new plants and develop improved varieties.

The Multi Skill Foundation Course Lab established in the school provides a golden opportunity for the students to become self-reliant at the school level. Students will learn new things by recognizing their technical skills. In this lab, they will also be able to choose the skills according to their interest. By acquiring skills from the lab, students will be able to get employment opportunities in the engineering, hotel and agriculture sectors.
