Studying Indian languages helps students connect with their roots, culture and heritage, fostering pride and a sense of identity as Indians.



The National Education Policy emphasizes giving equal importance to Indian languages alongside other subjects to build a strong and inclusive educational ecosystem.





Implementation of the 3-language policy in CBSE schools for classes 6 to 9 in 2026-27, in accordance with NEP 2020.

Key Features of the CBSE Three-Language Policy

1. The CBSE Three-Language Policy is fully aligned with the NEP 2020 and the National Curriculum Framework (NCF) 2023.
2. It is a flexible, inclusive, non-imposing, future-oriented, transformative, and unifying language policy designed to meet the aspirations and requirements of Viksit Bharat 2047.
3. No single language is mandatory under this policy.
4. The policy stipulates that two of the three languages studied must be Indian languages. There are several reasons for this requirement. In different parts of the country, students may speak one language at home, another in their neighborhood, a third at school, and yet another in the marketplace. In the future, they may also need to use different languages in their workplaces. Therefore, students should be equipped with the ability to communicate in multiple languages. To achieve this, they are encouraged to learn at least two Indian languages.
5. People frequently move from one linguistic region of India to another for employment, higher education, and various other opportunities. This makes learning multiple Indian languages both useful and beneficial.
6. For a person who already knows one Indian language, learning another Indian language is not the same as learning a foreign language or a language that is not native to India. Indian languages share many common features, including sound systems, sentence structures, vocabulary patterns, and cultural references. Therefore, learning additional Indian languages should not be viewed as an extra burden on students.
7. School-going children naturally possess the ability to learn and understand multiple languages simultaneously and with ease. Hence, learning more languages—especially Indian languages—should not be considered burdensome.
8. The difficulty involved in learning a second Indian language is significantly lower than that of learning a foreign language or a language that is not native to India.
9. In cities and villages across India, people generally live in a multilingual environment. This naturally creates a favorable setting for learning additional Indian languages.
10. Students in CBSE schools are already studying three languages in Classes VI, VII, and VIII. The current CBSE policy aims to continue this practice up to Class X.
11. Only a small number of students—primarily in a few well-known schools in major cities—opt for foreign languages. Under this policy, they may continue studying those languages as an additional language.
12. The list of optional languages offered by CBSE is among the largest provided by any school education board in the world. It gives students a valuable opportunity to learn diverse languages during their school years.
13. Most State Secondary Education Boards teach three languages from Classes VI to X, including English and two Indian languages. CBSE is adopting a similar pattern.
14. CBSE has taken into account the challenges schools may face while implementing this policy and, through its Circular dated 15 May 2026, has suggested practical solutions to address various school

level concerns.

15. No language has been given preference over another Indian language, nor is any language being imposed on anyone.

16. Complete information is available on the CBSE website, and the relevant circular can be accessed through the official CBSE Academic portal.

17. This policy promotes multilingual learning and helps students become more confident in using and communicating in multiple languages.

18. Schools can adapt to the changes smoothly, as many students already study English, Odia, and another Indian language such as Hindi or Sanskrit.

19. The policy strengthens Indian languages by ensuring that students learn at least two Indian languages.

20. Students are unlikely to face significant disruption, as the number of students opting for foreign languages is very small.

21. Schools with strong regional-language programs can continue their existing language framework without major changes.

22. The policy helps students remain connected to their local language, culture,

and identity.

23. To make the transition easier, CBSE has allowed students beginning a third language to start with textbooks designed for the Class VI level.

24. For students currently studying in Class IX, assessment of the new R-3 language will be conducted internally by schools, reducing the pressure of Board examinations.

25. Students' performance in the third language will also be reflected in the CBSE certificate, recognizing and acknowledging their language-learning efforts.

26. The policy promotes balanced education by giving importance to linguistic skills alongside other academic subjects.

27. It addresses the needs of students from all states, all linguistic backgrounds, and all sections of society.

28. The policy promotes and strengthens India's linguistic diversity while fostering national unity and integration.

29. It enables students to access the vast and diverse knowledge systems preserved in Indian languages, including literature, culture, science, philosophy, and traditional wisdom.

Panchpadi Learning Method Training Workshop
