Education Philosophy of Sister Nivedita



Margaret Noble, Britain's Renowned Educationalist

AD In 1884, Margaret Noble started her teaching career and was introduced to the new education system propounded by Pestalozzi and Froebel.

In 1895, to implement her own ideas regarding education, Margaret started her own school named Ruskin School in Wimbledon. Within a short time, Margaret's name began to spread as a good teacher and educationist. She started writing articles in various newspapers and magazines. Due to her intellectual ability, she came to be considered among the upper class of London. Gradually it became a center of education and literary movement, resulting in the birth of the famous Sesame Club. Years later, her brother wrote about her – Wherever she went, a library club sprang up.

Margaret Noble becomes Nivedita

Swami Vivekananda initiated Margaret into the Hindu religion. Margaret was taken to the temple and then Swamiji taught her how to worship Shiva. She was sworn into celibacy and given the name 'Nivedita', meaning dedicated. Margaret Noble was an intelligent thinker and spiritual seeker. She was the daughter of a Christian pioneer, yet she choose to be initiated into Hinduism.

Nivedita is everyone's Sister

During the training period, Nivedita was enthusiastic in discussing the issue of schools for girls with Swami Vivekananda. Swamiji wanted Nivedita to start a school. According to Swamiji, once the feeling of self-sacrifice comes, the work plan becomes integrated and success is achieved. To become a real teacher of Hindu women, Nivedita herself would first have to become a Hindu woman.

Starting of girls's School

When Swami ji felt that Nivedita had agreed to run the school, he had to go to his acquaintances and gather support for the school. Finally, the school started on 12 November 1898. Srima Sharda came to the inauguration and gave her blessings. Nivedita would decorate the school with flowers and ask the students to offer flowers at the feet of Holy Mother Sharda Devi. Nivedita had named the school 'Ramakrishna Balika Vidyalaya'.

Some Western people called it 'Vivekananda Vidyalaya' and the people there knew it as 'Sister Nivedita Vidyalaya'.

Nivedita as Teacher

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When Nivedita was asked for advice, Swamiji said – You are self-guided. You are going to learn everything from your female students. Nivedita did not impose her views but saw that the girls started developing naturally through known cultural subjects. Nivedita tried to leave an imprint of national ideas in the minds of the Girl students through

everything including their activities, behavior, language, dress, education, music, etc. She started singing Vande Mataram daily in the school. She tried to inculcate the same faith and belief in her students so that they understand the national objective equally deeply.

She wanted her students to learn to be tough when necessary because being delicate was their innate nature. To destroy evil one should not be humble at all. She tried to keep them informed about the happenings in the country. She used to take high-class girl students in a car to listen to the speeches of Surendranath Banerjee. One day Amala Bose, wife of Acharya Jagadish Chandra Bose, came to their school and the students sang the song "Bang Abhaar Janani Amar". When the girls were singing, tears of joy started rolling down their eyes. When the national convention of Congress was held in Calcutta, Nivedita asked her students to embroider and make a model of the national flag. According to her, the saffron color reflects the spiritual tradition of Bharat. Hence the color of that flag was saffron.

Nivedita as an Educationist

Education is not just about giving information but also about awakening strong feelings for the great men of our country. Nivedita was full of these feelings. The history of Bharat came alive through his imagination and description.

Nivedita was very keen that the girl students should learn their mother tongue well. She herself learned small Bengali words.

Education in Bharat should not be only for nationalism but for nation-building. Our children should remain surrounded by the concerns of the nation and the country. From them, we should demand sacrifice for Bharat, demand devotion, and knowledge. Ideal for themselves and Bharat for Bharat should be the aim of their life.

Whatever the field of work, the welfare of Bharat and the awakening of Bharatiya's consciousness was his foremost concern. She wanted a plan to have educationists who would understand and propagate the vision of Swami Vivekananda. He clarified that education is not only good for children but it is also good for the country and religion. This thought should always remain in the minds of educationists.

Nivedita had many plans for education. Despite government opposition, she wanted our schools should be training institutions for Bharatiya to improve national education. One of his ideas was to build a hostel for boys. The boys will study while staying in the hostel and will tour the country for six months so that knowledge of the country and love for the country develop within them. When Rabindranath Tagore started Shanti Niketan, the students of Nivedita Vidyalaya became the majority of female teachers there.

Bharat Bhakta Nivedita

One day Nivedita asked her students who is the queen of Bharat. The students answered, Queen Victoria. *Cont...*

Obviously, Nivedita looked upset after hearing his answer. She was both sad and angry. She shouted and said – You people don't even know who is the queen of Bharat. Then clarifying, she said – Look, the Queen of England can never be



the Queen of Bharat. Your queen is Sita Rani. Sita Rani is the eternal queen of Bharat. Swamiji had explained to Nivedita that one should never deviate from our traditional ideals of sacrifice and service in the education of women. There is a need for education of the women of Bharat but first of all the spiritual ideals of sacrifice and service have to be inculcated. Nivedita tried to follow these instructions of Swamiji with heart and soul.

Shri Rabindranath Tagore had requested Nivedita to teach English to his daughter. But Nivedita asked him, what is the point in imposing foreign ideals and standards? In my opinion, proper education means that the abilities hidden in a person should be allowed to come out. Therefore, she was not ready to give an English education because she had not come to this land to teach English language and culture to Bharatiya women. Nivedita's field of work was entirely in the national interest.

Nivedita's Vision for Bharat

Nivedita always emphasized that Bharat is one and she felt that if all Bharatiyas thought about this truth for a few minutes every day, Bharat would become a great power and no one would be able to harm it.

Nivedita said – "I believe that power which is present in the Vedas and Upanishads, in the teachings of scholars and in the meditation of saints in the creation of religions and empires, has once again been born and its name is nationalism. I believe that Bharat's present is deeply rooted in its past and that it has a bright future ahead of it."

His deep love for Bharat was reflected in every aspect of his life. She was a revolutionary like fire. Sri Aurobindo used to call her 'Agni Shikha'. She was also a Yogini. She was also an educationist and art critic. Rabindranath Tagore called her 'Mahasweta'. Sister Nivedita also got the nickname 'Lokmata'.
